# Discussions around Agenda:

# Academic Targets for Middle School Admission

- To support DOE diversity goals, District 3 is considering proposing that all D3 middle schools, including Booker T., increase the percentage of offers to students receiving a score of 1 or 2 on State Exams. In 2017, 6% of Booker T.'s offers to incoming 6<sup>th</sup> grade class received a 1 score and 6% received a 2 score. The proposal is to increase the offers, for the incoming class of 2019, to 10% receiving a 1 score and 15% receiving a 2 score.
- The SLT is supportive of the intent to increase diversity in schools. However, they are concerned with the proposed approach for two reasons. First, they question whether it will achieve the intended goal of racial and economic diversity. Second, they don't feel teachers will be able to adequately meet the academic needs, in a classroom of 30+ students, of both accelerated students (on path to take Regents) and students who need extra support to reach grade level requirements (state test score of 1 or 2).
- Why are schools like Wadleigh being closed, rather than improved?
- General opinion of SLT: This proposal needs more research. Is there data which supports this as the best approach? Are there better ways to achieve the diversity goals?
- Parents and teachers should get involved and voice their opinions.

#### Walkout Plan

- The 8th Grade Student Council is planning a School Walkout on March 14<sup>th</sup> at 10:00am in response to the shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School and as a part of the #ENOUGH National School Walkout initiative.
- This is a student-led initiative, not led by teachers nor administration. Eighth grade students will visit the  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$  graders ahead of the walkout to communicate the plans.
- The Plan:
  - Begin walkout from main entrance and walk to yard. Will hang banners in yard which students can sign and write comments on.

- o There will be an organized program including speeches, reading of the victims' names, and releasing 17 dove balloons.
- o Students plan to wear orange and black.

### GOAL 2. SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

By June 2018, the school will develop and implement a peer-buddy program in order to help support sixth graders in their transition to middle school, as measured by a majority of the students responding positively on a survey administered twice during the year.

#### New Business:

- High school admission results were released this week. The school does not yet have a summary by High School (waiting on aggregated data file). There are 33 Booker T. students who did not get a match. This is up from 26 students last year (but initially seems consistent with an increase seen at other middle schools). Booker T. administration held a meeting yesterday for the 33 impacted families and will also set up individualized meetings. Administration will actively work with these families on appeals and round 2 applications. There will be more information available on open slots once NYC students accept/decline offers by March 26<sup>th</sup> deadline.
